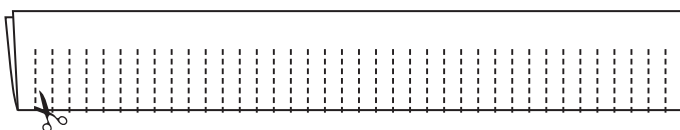
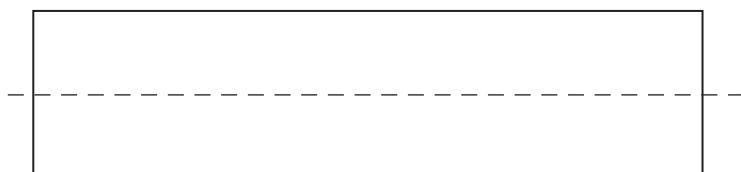
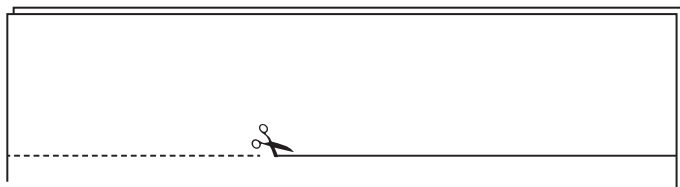
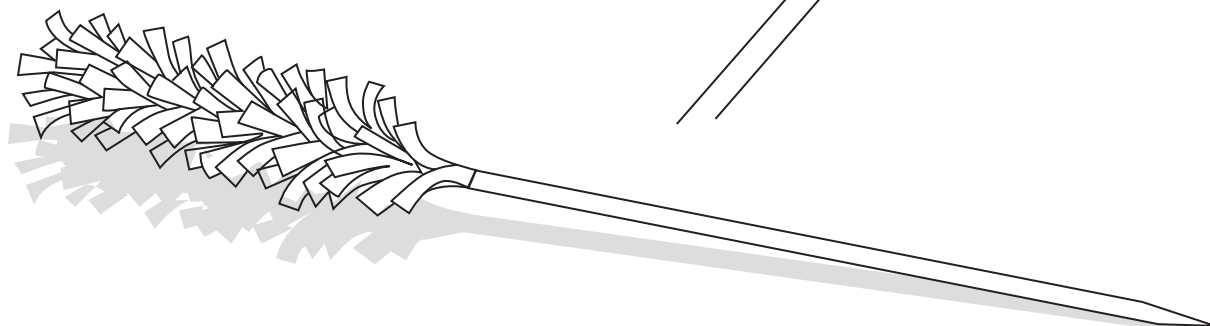
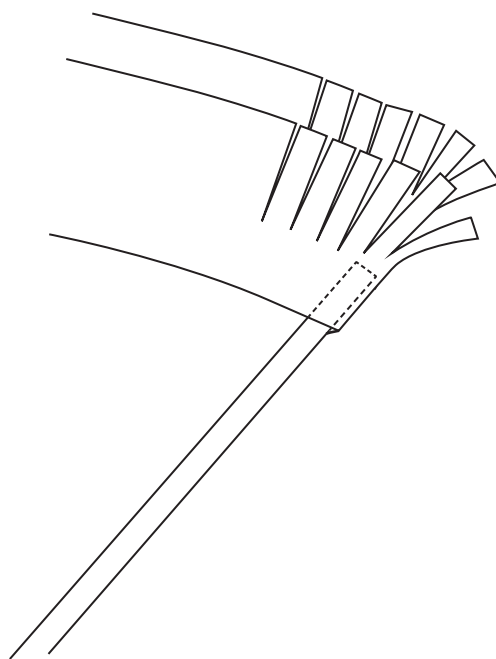


HAM SKEWER



- 1 Cut out two strips along the length of both pieces of paper (helps to lay them over each other). The strips should be about five centimetres wide.
- 2 Fold the two strips in half lengthwise, along the centre. Let them overlap each other or place them in one another.
- 3 Cut two-thirds into the paper from the folded side. Cut along the entire length of the strips, at a half centimetre distance.

- 4 Separate the strips. Attach one strip using glue at the top of the skewer. Fringes facing upwards.
- 5 Do the same with the second strip, just below the first.
- 6 Roll the two strips down around the skewer, at a workable angle, until the paper or skewer ends. Attach both with adhesive.



As you will have probably noticed, the silk paper is in Profood colours. Now that you made a Profood skewer, and got the knack of it, it is time to move on. Try using more paper, more colours, with different

thicknesses, sheen, or otherwise.
